
Now in 2026, our focus is clear: translate years of work into shared direction and meaningful action. In partnership

# *our* PROGRAM PILLARS



## PHOSPHORUS REDUCTION

In collaboration with our partners, the GLA implements solutions to reduce the lake's incoming phosphorus pollution—which impairs Green Lake's water quality, fueling plant growth and degrading conditions for both our community and aquatic animals.



## AQUATIC INVASIVE SPECIES PREVENTION

To protect Green Lake's water quality, the GLA minimizes the spread of new and existing aquatic invasive species through preventative measures and community education.



## DATA EVALUATION

The GLA gathers data and information that drives the Lake Management Planning Team to identify water quality problems, inform solutions, and track our collective progress.



## COMMUNITY ACTIVATION

The GLA cultivates community engagement in the health of the lake by mobilizing our members, volunteers, and partners to act on Green Lake's behalf.

# 2025 IMPACT throughout the WATERSHED



## PHOSPHORUS REDUCTION

- 1 LAKE-FRIENDLY AGRICULTURE EQUIPMENT**  
The GLA's prior investment in a no-till drill continues to support producers across the watershed. Leased annually through the Green Lake County Land Conservation Department, the equipment seeded 163 acres of lake-friendly plantings in 2025, helping reduce erosion and nutrient runoff.
- 2 PHOSPHORUS CAPTURE PILOT PROJECT**  
77 samples were collected from a pilot project that uses absorptive media to capture phosphorus from a 100-acre farm field.
- 3 DEMONSTRATION FARMS**  
The GLA supported two demonstration farms—Pollack-Vu Dairy and Badtke Dairy LLC—within the Upper Fox-Wolf Demonstration Farms Network to reduce phosphorus and sediment runoff.

## AQUATIC INVASIVE SPECIES PREVENTION

- 4 CLEAN BOATS, CLEAN WATERS PROGRAM**  
Inspectors logged more than 800 hours at 8 public boat landings, engaging with 2,100 boaters and identifying 13 AIS potentially exposed to Green Lake from surrounding waterbodies.
- 5 SELF-SERVICE BOAT WASH STATION**  
The Dodge Memorial County Park boat wash station logged 1,500 uses from April through October, helping prevent the spread of AIS.

- 6 CD3 CLEANING STATION**  
The CD3 station at Horner's Landing was used 397 times to reduce the risk of AIS entering Green Lake.
- 7 CARP REMOVAL**  
With funding support from the GLA, 5,200 pounds of carp were removed by the GLSD to reduce sediment disturbance.

## DATA EVALUATION

- 8 BLUE-GREEN ALGAE SAMPLING PROGRAM**  
The GLA collected 120 samples at six lake locations to track harmful algal blooms and strengthen long-term trend analysis.
- 9 USGS TRIBUTARY SAMPLING PROGRAM**  
In partnership with GLSD and USGS, 130 samples were collected at seven tributary sites to monitor nutrient inputs and track water quality trends.
- 10 GREEN LAKE INTERNAL LOADING STUDY**  
17 samples were collected and sent to a lab to understand the potential recycling of phosphorus from Green Lake's deepest sediments.

- 11 SEDIMENT & SENSOR ANALYSIS**  
8 sediment samples and oxygen and temperature sensor data were analyzed in 2025 to understand phosphorus release from the inlet's sediments.
- 12 SENSITIVE SPRING WATCH PROGRAM**  
The GLA collected 18 nutrient samples over six months from Powell Spring, Glen Creek at Mitchell Glen, and Dakin Creek

to monitor groundwater in ecologically sensitive areas and provide early detection of potential impacts on water quality.

- 13 AQUATIC PLANT MANAGEMENT PLAN**  
The Wisconsin DNR approved Green Lake's Aquatic Plant Management Plan, informed by more than 3,100 point-intercept survey samples mapping plant growth across the lake.

## COMMUNITY ACTIVATION

- 14 LAKE CLASS AND CURRICULUM WORKSHOPS**  
One administrator and 16 teachers from the Green Lake School District participated in Lake Class and Watershed Education Program curriculum workshops, expanding lake-based learning to 270 district students. An additional 29 students from Ripon High School experienced hands-on lake learning through Lake Class, building a deeper connection to Green Lake.
- 15 COMMUNITY EVENTS**  
More than 260 community members attended the State of the Lake Breakfast and Annual Meeting, and 250 guests gathered at The Lake Ball and The After Party to celebrate and support Green Lake.

- 16 WATER QUALITY AMBASSADOR PROGRAM**  
63 volunteers logged more than 800 hours collecting water quality data across the watershed, strengthening long-term monitoring efforts.



## Reducing Phosphorus Takes Time— and a Shared Roadmap

*Building the science and coordination needed for lasting progress*

Excess phosphorus remains the greatest challenge facing Green Lake. Reducing it at a scale meaningful enough to improve water quality is not quick or simple. It requires time, coordination, and a clear understanding of where nutrients originate—and how they move through both the watershed and the lake.

In 2025, our phosphorus reduction work focused on strengthening that foundation for long-term progress. Together with local, state, and federal partners, we advanced the development of a new Watershed & Lake Management Plan (WLMP)—a shared, science-based roadmap that will guide future restoration decisions and align actions across the watershed. When submitted to the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR) and Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) in 2026, the WLMP will help ensure that future investments are targeted, coordinated, and effective—so every dollar and every project moves the lake closer to recovery.

Where the science is already clear, we continued moving from planning to action. In the priority Roy Creek subwatershed, we are initiating phosphorus reduction projects in partnership with the Green Lake County Land Conservation Department that were identified from a previous stream erosion inventory completed by the GLA in 2023. We also continue working

with the Green Lake Sanitary District and the WDNR to advance long-term restoration initiatives in the County K Marsh area—testing approaches that could inform broader strategies in the years ahead.

On the land, collaboration with farmers remained essential. We continued supporting two demonstration farms and leased access to a shared no-till drill with a prairie seed attachment through Green Lake County Land Conservation Department, allowing producers across the watershed to plant crops that build healthier soils and reduce nutrient runoff. This sustained work strengthens farm resilience while protecting the lake.

In the lake itself, the completion of the field work for an internal loading study marked a major milestone. Once analysis is complete, these findings will clarify how much phosphorus is being released from Green Lake’s deepest sediments—information that will help shape future management strategies and focus efforts where they can have the greatest impact.

**Measurable reductions in phosphorus take time. But 2025 represented meaningful progress—strengthening the science, partnerships, and shared planning needed to move from understanding the challenge to advancing long-term management efforts for Green Lake.**

## Training Today for Tomorrow's Threats

*How hands-on monitoring builds long-term capacity*

On a calm fall evening, the GLA programs team—made up of John Strauser and Grace St. Clair—headed out onto the lake alongside partners from the WDNR and Golden Sands Resource Conservation & Development Council. Their destination wasn't a shoreline or a dock, but the open, quiet water where a small but important kind of monitoring takes place.

Spiny water flea are tiny aquatic invasive species that are nearly invisible to the naked eye, yet capable of disrupting a lake's food web. Once established, they consume native zooplankton that normally keep algae in check—often leading to increased algal growth, degraded water quality, and cascading impacts throughout the food web.

Because spiny water flea move upward toward the surface at night to feed on zooplankton, the team worked after sunset using specialized plankton nets, carefully towing the nets at the thermocline—the distinct layer in the lake where warm surface water meets colder, deeper water—to collect samples. No spiny water flea were observed during the tow, and the samples are currently being processed by the Wisconsin State Laboratory of Hygiene for further analysis.

Equally important, the evening served as hands-on training—building the GLA's ability to conduct this monitoring in the future. **By developing this expertise locally, we're strengthening long-term capacity and supporting ongoing surveillance efforts—an approach endorsed by WDNR Invasive Species Coordinator Patrick Siwula.**

That readiness matters. Spiny water flea have already been detected at very high densities in Lake Monona and Lake Mendota. If they were ever found in Green Lake, there would be no quick fix—but early detection would give us critical information. It would allow us to work closely with the WDNR to understand what's happening, anticipate potential impacts, and adapt our monitoring and management priorities with intention and care.

Most people never see this side of lake protection. But on quiet nights like this one, when the lake is still and the work is slow and careful, the foundation for long-term stewardship is built. **By investing in knowledge, partnerships, and capacity today, we're better prepared to protect Green Lake for the future.**

## Understanding Green Lake, Season By Season

*Year-round monitoring through strong partnerships*

All year long—through summer heat, fall storms, winter ice, and spring thaw—the GLA works in close partnership with the United States Geological Survey (USGS) and the Green Lake Sanitary District (GLSD) to monitor water quality across the lake and its tributaries.

This collaboration combines complementary roles and shared investment: the USGS operates automated sampling equipment and gathers lake samples, the GLSD and GLA provide cost-sharing, and GLA staff collect additional biweekly and storm-event samples that expand the dataset and capture seasonal and storm-driven conditions. In 2025, the GLA collected 130 supplemental water samples across Green Lake’s tributaries.

Together, the program collects critical water quality data from sites around the lake and its streams. This long-term, all-season data is essential to understanding how Green Lake truly functions. It reveals how nutrients move through the system, how conditions change from winter to summer,

and how today’s patterns compare to decades past. These measurements form the scientific backbone of nearly every major decision we make—from tracking phosphorus trends to informing future management strategies that protect water quality, recreation, and the lake’s long-term health.

That commitment doesn’t pause when conditions are difficult. Even as winter settles over Green Lake, monitoring continues beneath the ice, ensuring seasonal gaps don’t limit what we know or how we plan.

This continuity strengthens our ability to detect change, interpret trends accurately, and respond with confidence as new challenges emerge.

Year-round monitoring isn’t just data collection—it’s an investment in knowledge. **By understanding Green Lake in every season, we’re better equipped to anticipate challenges, make science-based decisions, and protect this remarkable lake for generations to come.**

## Inspiring the Next Generation of Lake Stewards

*Lake-based learning for every Green Lake student*

Protecting Green Lake for the long-term means investing in the people who will inherit it.

The GLA’s Watershed Education Program helps nurture that connection by bringing students and educators into meaningful, hands-on learning experiences rooted in the Green Lake watershed. Through lake-based curriculum, teacher support, and coordinated field trips, students learn how the land, streams, and lake are connected—and why caring for water quality matters.

In 2025, the GLA funded a professional education consultant to design grade-appropriate lessons aligned with district standards and classroom needs. We also supported training sessions for one administrator and 16 teachers from the Green Lake School District, expanding lake-based learning opportunities for all 270 students.

As a result, lake education is now integrated across the Green Lake School District. Every student, in every grade, participates in lake-centered learning that builds understanding from repeated experiences rather than

relying on one-time events. Teachers are supported with clear, ready-to-use curriculum, and students develop a shared foundation of knowledge about how the lake functions and why it matters.

Whether students were exploring the shoreline, observing habitat, or practicing basic water quality testing, students are building curiosity, confidence, and a deeper sense of responsibility for the place they call home.

**This program is strengthened by the Leola Culver Family Foundation, whose \$500,000 endowment commitment in 2024 is helping make lake-based learning a lasting part of the student experience.**

Their support ensures that students throughout the watershed can learn from the lake and its streams, both in the classroom and out in the field.

**By supporting local teachers and inspiring young learners, this work is helping grow a generation that knows Green Lake—and will be ready to care for it in the years ahead.**

# 2025 FINANCIALS





### MAJOR CAMPAIGN PLEDGES DUE 2026–2030: \$2.5M


