From ages eight months to eighty, over 100 people gathered at the Dukelow Farm in August for the Land & Lake Family Field Day. Duke Dukelow and his daughter, Rhonda "Ronnie" Bocek, hosted the event to demonstrate how conservation practices on the farm can protect the environment and be profitable.

FUTURE FARMER SCHOLARSHIPS

The average age of a farmer in the Green Lake watershed is 64 years. With a generational transfer of farmland on the horizon, investing in the education of students with an interest in farming is more important than ever.

DAKIN CREEK

It was all hands-on-Dakin Creek during September & October's stream restoration workdays. Thank you to the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, Green Lake School District students, Boy Scout Troop 630, and all the volunteers who came out to help.

By removing stream obstructions, relocating rocks, and digging clearer channels, we strengthened and adapted Dakin Creek's banks and natural flow—with the aim to improve water quality and bring back brook trout in spring 2020.

EVERY MILE MATTERS

THE PRE- AND POST-RESTORATION OF ROY CREEK

The work that needs to be done to protect Green Lake cannot be done alone. When we work together, we can accomplish more and have a greater impact in our community. This principle was put into action during the Roy Creek stream restoration, when the GLA and several organizations partnered to fully fund this restoration project, completed in 2019 on the property of Dave and Becky Waldvogel.

The section of Roy Creek, adjacent to the their land, had steep eroding banks and cracked chunks of land ready to cave-in to the stream below. Upon completion of the project, nearly 3,000 feet had been restored. Those eroding banks are now transformed with gentle slopes and meandering curves.

To Dave and Becky Waldvogel, this stream restoration project meant protecting Green Lake's downstream water quality, reducing the loss of valuable top soil, protecting crops from flooding, improving field access, and keeping people safer on the farm by protecting them from bank collapses while operating equipment.

This project was made possible through donated funds and services from the Green Lake Association, Green Lake Sanitary District, Green Lake County Land Conservation Department, Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, and the Natural Resources Conservation Service.

"The funding was extremely important," said Becky. "We're 100% certain this project would not have happened without it. The whole agricultural economy is tough right now. There's no money for extra projects like this."

"We're the temporary caretakers of the land," she added. "If we don't do this important work, who will?"

Thanks to Project Clean Streams donors, the GLA was able to donate \$10,000 to help fully underwrite the cost of this important stream restoration project. Funds given by donors make a positive impact to protect the lake, the land and the lives of people in our community.

SHINING BRIGHT FOR BIG GREEN

2019 GALA IN REVIEW

The Green Lake community came together in a big way for the Green Lake Association's 10th Annual Gala, celebrating their love for the lake and making the work of the GLA possible. Through sponsorships, live auctions, raffles, Pillar Project pledges, and attendance, the 344 guests generously supported the GLA's mission to pass on a cleaner, healthier Green Lake to the next generation. With record attendance, A Night Among the Stars was the GLA's most successful Gala in the event's ten-year history.

To recognize stars in the community who are dedicated stewards of Green Lake, the GLA announced its inaugural Watershed Hero Award. The 2019 awardees were: Shoreline Boat Center, Avalon Creek Farm, and a posthumous award for Charlie Marks (1959-2019).

JOHN AND JENNIFER MEIBORG

The Shoreline Boat Center was acknowledged for its exceptional willingness to use its business to advocate on behalf of the Green Lake Association's mission. On top of donating their space as a venue for the Annual Gala, owners John and Jennifer Meiborg initiated the idea to distribute GLA materials about protecting Green Lake's water quality to individuals who purchase a boat from them.

AVALON CREEK FARM

Avalon Creek Farm owners, Brad and Lynne Goldsmith, have built on the legacy of Lloyd and Leonore Dickman, including stream restoration, conservation easements, and their willingness to open their property to be used as a learning laboratory.

CHARLIE MARKS

Charlie Marks, who unexpectedly passed away in January 2019, was the former Administrator of the Green Lake Sanitary District and all-around champion of Green Lake. His decades of outstanding work on behalf of Green Lake raised the bar of lake protection—by securing grants, installing conservation practices, restoring wetlands, and designing carp barriers, among other accomplishments. His wife Cathy Marks accepted the award on his behalf.

EYES ON THE LAKE

The Green Lake Association is dedicated to protecting the natural resource we all love. We recognize that long-term environmental and human pressures are causing Green Lake to change. Our community's growing concern for the lake's water quality motivates us to act. With your continued support, we are committed to having an even deeper impact on the health of Big Green, together. We hold fast to a deep hope that the lake that we see today will one day be restored to the lake that we remember.

In the meantime, when issues come up that no one anticipates—such as this year's beach advisory from high *E. coli* levels at Dodge Memorial Park and the swimmer's itch concentrated in Norwegian Bay—the GLA prides itself on providing prompt and accurate information about the lake's status and human health impacts.

E. COLI LEVELS IN THE LAKE

Twice this past summer, water samples taken at Dodge Memorial park showed elevated *E. coli* levels. The measured levels were high enough to warrant a beach advisory, as this type of bacteria can be harmful to human health. The GLA was in close communication with the Green Lake Sanitary District (which is responsible for the sampling) and Green Lake County Health & Human Services (which organizes beach advisories). In turn, we promptly shared up-to-date information with our members and the community at-large so that lake-goers were informed and safe.

MONITORING FOR TOXIC ALGAE BLOOMS

Toxic algae blooms—such as those caused by cyanobacteria, or "blue-green algae"—can be harmful to humans and pets. Not all algae are harmful, but specific types can create toxic substances that leach into the water. These chemicals can cause skin and respiratory irritation in humans, and can be fatal to animals.

Increased nutrient pollution is usually the trigger for these harmful algal blooms. With increased rain events bringing more phosphorus pollution to Green Lake, the GLA decided it was important to begin monitoring for these harmful algal blooms and their toxins in strategic locations on Green Lake.

We took six samples throughout the summer and had them analyzed by the Wisconsin State Lab of Hygiene. The good news is that these samples did not show any results that indicated a threat in the locations where samples were taken. We will continue to conduct event-based monitoring in the future.

If you see anything suspicious on the water, please let us know.

SWIMMER'S ITCH IN NORWEGIAN BAY

When swimmer's itch was reported around the July 4th weekend, the GLA created an online survey to track occurrences and location. We stayed in communication with local news sources and businesses so that everyone enjoying the beautiful summer days on the lake could reduce their risk of getting this uncomfortable rash.

While not life threatening, swimmer's itch is caused by a snail parasite that causes skin irritation and itching, as the name suggests. Snails linked to swimmer's itch tend to prefer areas with shallow water and higher nutrient content. There is no approved or effective treatment to prevent swimmer's itch in a waterbody.

Such extensive reports of swimmer's itch are rare on Green Lake.

While underlying ecological factors can create favorable conditions for the parasites, the presence of swimmer's itch is not necessarily an indicator of an overall water quality problem.

The GLA will watch closely for signs of a return of swimmer's itch in 2020 and keep the community informed of occurrences. If you experience or hear of another cluster of swimmer's itch cases on Green Lake, please let us know.

CHARTING PROGRESS

Green Lake is the heart of our community. It deserves to be cared for and preserved. The lake is facing serious water quality challenges, but the GLA is here year-round, dedicated to finding and implementing practices that aim to protect and improve this precious natural resource.

From our Pillar Project initiatives (Project Clean Streams, Project Green Acres and Project Invader Defense), to education and outreach events, to partnering with organizations on projects that support clean water in our community, the GLA is committed to caring for the lake we all love.


